



Job Search Sites for Professional Job Opportunities

(for those with Undergraduate and/or Graduate degrees in public health or related field)

Sites that focus primarily on job opportunities within the greater Milwaukee area, or within the State of Wisconsin:

- **Indeed.com**, <https://www.indeed.com/local/Milwaukee-WI-jobs>. This site focuses on non-profit and community organizations that are seeking employees in Milwaukee, but also other areas nationwide.
- **MilwaukeeJobs.com**, <https://www.milwaukeejobs.com/>. General job site in Milwaukee area.
- **Milwaukee Journal Sentinel**, <http://www.jsonline.com/marketplace/jobs/>. This site cross posts with Monster.com related to Milwaukee area positions. Many governmental agencies and small employers may not have robust advertising budgets and/or follow antiquated human resources practices and post positions only herein and on their website.
- **MonsterJobs.com**, <https://www.monster.com/jobs/l-milwaukee,-wi.aspx>. Links to the Milwaukee Journal Sentinel, and is a low-cost option for companies entering the web recruitment world.
- **Wisconsin Public Health Association**, http://www.wpha.org/networking/opening_search.asp. This site will include primarily professional-level staff positions in local health departments and public health system partners. The use of this site is expanding each year, so it can be an excellent resource for statewide recruitment opportunities.
- **Wisconsin Association of Local Health Departments and Boards**, <http://www.walhdab.org/default.asp?page=CareerCenter>. This site will include primarily professional-level staff positions in local health departments and affiliated governmental organizations. Its use is expanding each year, so it can be an excellent resource for statewide recruitment opportunities.

At a national level the following are the key sites, but if you are not searching nationally the sites will allow you to search for Wisconsin or another state if that is your focus area:

I personally feel this is the most comprehensive national-level public health job site, and includes both professional and academic positions across a variety of public health system partners.
- **Public Health Jobs**, <http://publichealthjobs.org/>. This is the job site managed by the Association of Schools and Programs of Public Health. While it provides a

comprehensive listing of public health positions, it doesn't appear to have the volume of position listings that other sites have.

- **American Public Health Association**, <https://apha.org/professional-development/public-health-careermart>. This site will include primarily professional-level staff positions in local health departments and public health system partners.
- **National Association of County & City Health Officials**, <http://careers.naccho.org/jobs>. This site will include primarily professional-level staff positions in local health departments and affiliated governmental organizations.

Similarly, you may consider the healthcare system sites directly for similar positions within their larger organization, including, Aurora, ProHealth, Ascension, UW-Hospitals, etc. As the healthcare systems advance their work in population health and community health needs assessment, they have made a concerted effort to hire public health trained personnel to lead these efforts. For example, Aurora has two Master's-prepared staff leading their community assessment work; these positions, and similar positions in other health systems, are in the community benefits area. In larger health systems with research departments, they may also hire epidemiologist, project analysts and/or coordinators, and policy staff.
